School Meals

School meals are free for children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.

Meals for children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 should be paid for **in advance** via ParentPay. Accounts that fall into debt will be asked to provide a packed lunch until the debt is cleared.

Meals cost \pounds 2.50 per day (\pounds 12.50 per week). Please see the menu on our website for the options available each day.

Year 6 Residential Trip to Kingswood

Our Year 6 residential trip this year will be to Kingswood in Hexham in June. Letters have gone out with full information about this trip, but if you have any questions please see Mr Smith. The deadline for the £50 deposit is 21st February, with full payment being due by 23rd May.

Mosque Trip—3rd February

Y4, Y5 and Y6 have the opportunity to visit Al Azhar Mosque in South Shields on 3rd February. As part of their RE curriculum through the year, they will be learning about diverse faiths and religions outside Catholicism, and visiting other places of worship is a great way to do this. Sessions at the Mosque are led by community volunteers and include information about Islam and a tour of the Mosque. We are asking for a contribution of £9 towards to coach hire for this trip, please make a payment via ParentPay if possible.

Royal Northern Sinfonia Trip

On 4th March, KS2 have the opportunity to watch the Royal Northern Sinfonia perform at the Glasshouse. This is a special concert for schools, to open up the world of classical music to children and inspire their creativity. The orchestra will perform pieces from the vast BBC Ten Pieces library, helping our children discover music that breaks boundaries, inspires hope, and makes you want to dance!




