About Us



We are very proud that our school is named after St. Oswald. Saint Oswald was King of Northumbria in the 7th century and as a local saint, it is particularly relevant that we keep alive the story of his eventful life and his enduring faith.

Our School Day

Nursery

We run morning or afternoon sessions for children who are eligible for 15 hours of childcare or all-day sessions for children who are eligible for 30 hours of funded childcare. We accept children from the term after they turn 3 (terms start on 1st January, 1st April and 1st September).

8.45 am - 11.45 am Morning nursery session 12.15 pm - 3.15 pm Afternoon nursery session

All-day children attend both sessions each day, and there is a charge of £2.50 per day which covers the period between 11.45 and 12.15pm. A hot meal is included in this cost.

Key Stage 1/2

8.55 am-3.15pm

Children can enter school from 8.50am, a member of staff will be on duty in the yard.

We run a number of after school clubs during the year including: Multi-Skills, Athletics, Cookery, Football, Dance and Choir. Pupils sign up at the beginning of the term and there is a charge for these.

In the interest of safety, jewellery must **not** be worn in school at any time. We encourage the children to have appropriate hair styles for school, therefore tramlines in hair, shaven haircuts or dyed hair is not permitted.

Safeguarding

Safeguarding our pupils is our number one priority. All our staff are trained in Safeguarding procedures, our Headteacher and our Deputy Headteacher are our Designated Safeguarding Officers and all school staff have undertaken training in safeguarding and child protection. We also have a link governor for Child Protection and Safeguarding.

As a school we work closely with South Tyneside Council and Clennell Education Solutions Safeguarding teams. We follow the guidance of 'Keeping Children Safe in Education'. We regularly update our safeguarding procedures ensuring our school is a safe and secure environment for all.

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities

We believe that all children have an equal right to a full and rounded education which will enable them to achieve their full potential.

We have a SEND Coordinator in school who works in partnership with parents/carers, to ensure these needs are identified and plans developed to meet them. We also have a link governor for SEND.

Parents and carers will be fully informed and encouraged to be actively involved in a working partnership with

School Council

Our School Council meets regularly to discuss matters of interest to the pupils and the wider school community. Two representatives from each class are voted as councillors by their peers.

They have a responsibility to attend regular meetings, collect opinions from their class and then report back to the class on outcomes from the council meetings. We welcome the school councillors' input in to our school.

Mini Vinnies

Mini Vinnies are a junior section of the St. Vincent de Paul Society (SVP). This worldwide organisation works in most Catholic parishes promoting Christian love in action. It supports families who experience difficulties and those people who are sick or elderly.
