
As their first task this year, our Mini Vinnies will be leading the Macmillan coffee morning on Friday 4th October.

Our School Day

Our morning bell goes at 8.55am for Reception through to Year 6, and we finish our school day at 3.25pm. If you are going to be late to collect your child, or if someone different to usual will be collecting, please call the school office on 01915367922 to let us know.

The safety of our children is our highest priority, so if we have not been informed of a change in who is collecting, we will not allow the child to leave until we have confirmed with a parent.

Children who arrive through the front doors after the bell has gone will be marked as late in the register.

Walking Home Alone

Children in Year 5 and Year 6 are allowed to leave school alone as long as we have written permission from their parent.

If you would like your child to be dismissed at the end of school without a guardian present, please ask for a consent form from your child's teacher.

Once children have been dismissed from their classroom door they are no longer under the school's supervision, so please have a chat with them to ensure they understand how to get home responsibly. Please also talk to them about what to do if something unexpected happens on their way home.
